The KCC decides on the 2014 framework plan for the reevaluation of general-programming and news-only cable channels

The Korea Communications Commission (KCC, Chairman Kyeong-jae Lee) reviewed and made a decision on the 2014 framework plan for the reevaluation of four general-programming cable channels including TV Chosun and one news-only channel (Yonhap News TV), whose licenses are set to expire in 2014.

The KCC selected three focused areas for the 2014 re-licensing review: increased diversity in public opinions; promotion of content industries; and responsibilities to the public as broadcasters.

To minimize any controversy over the results of the evaluation, the Commission included detailed evaluation criteria in the aforementioned framework plan.

In the process, the KCC referred to the re-licensing criteria established for terrestrial TV broadcasters but also took into account the characteristics of general-programming and news-only cable channels.

The evaluation committee will consist of a total of 15 persons including the chairman and 14 experts from each specialized field, such as broadcasting, law, business management, and accounting.

Evaluation criteria were drawn up based on the proposals from a task force study group, as well as items required by law, previous re-licensing and re-approval cases, and feedback from expert meetings.

The framework plan provides nine evaluation items, as per Article 10 and 17 of the Broadcasting Act.

Out of the full 1,000 points, 350 will be decided by the broadcasting evaluation committee with regard to broadcast programs and the remaining 650 points will be given after reviewing each broadcaster's business plans.

The KCC has carefully selected the evaluation categories and determined their respective points based on the report of the study group and feedback from expert meetings, among others.

With the aim of enhancing the public responsibilities to be borne by the cable channels concerned, the Commission has allocated relatively higher scores to two items: (1) Fulfillment of public responsibility, impartiality, and public interest nature of broadcasting along with the protection of audience rights; and (2) Compliance with the requirements stipulated at the time of licensing and other matters necessary for conducting business.

The Commission decided to issue a renewed licence to those scoring 650

points or more, and conditional renewal or rejection of renewal to those not.

Note, however, that those who have garnered a total of 650 points or more can also be issued conditional renewal, if they obtain less than 40% of the points assigned in any one of the individual evaluation items.

In particular, the KCC will issue conditional renewal or rejection of renewal to a broadcaster scoring less than 50% of the points assigned in either of the two: (1) Fulfillment of public responsibility, impartiality, and public interest nature of broadcasting along with the protection of audience rights; (2) Appropriateness of the planning, programming, and production plans of broadcast programs.

The Commission plans to conclude its reevaluation according to the framework plan it decided today and make its final decision by February 2014.

Note, however, that the reevaluation procedures for MBN will commence in May 2014, since the broadcaster's license expires in November 2014.

□ Decisions on renewal of license

- o The KCC will issue renewed license for those scoring 650 points or more and conditional renewal or rejection of renewal to those not.
- o Those garnering 650 points or more can also be issued conditional renewal if they fail to get 40% of the points in any of the evaluation items.
- Note, however, that the KCC may issue conditional renewal or rejection of renewal to a broadcaster scoring less than 50% of the points assigned in either of the two: (1) Fulfillment of public responsibility, impartiality, and public interest nature of broadcasting along with the protection of audience rights; (2) Appropriateness of the planning, programming, and production plans of broadcast programs.
- o Those garnering 650 points or more can also be given conditions that they have to fulfill, so as to ensure that they will implement what they have stated in their applications and attached documents (business plans and written oaths).
